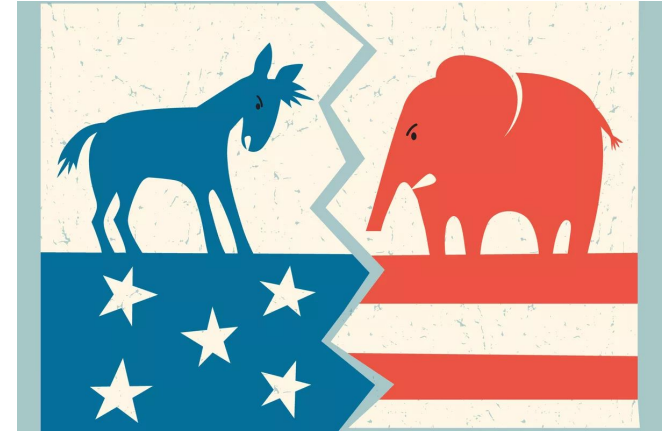
Who?

The House Judiciary Committee approved a bill on 11/20 that legalizes Marijuana on the federal level. This legislation was passed 24 to 10, and is now being sent to the house of representatives. It has a high chance of approval in the house due to the majority of seats being controlled by Democrats. The Republican controlled Senate will prove to be an obstacle for this bill to be passed. Democrats have started forming negotiations because the Republicans have stated they won't take the bill as is.

Actual approval was November 20, 2019

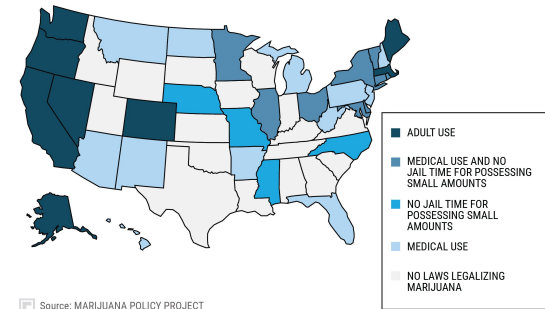


Why?

With the growing popularity of the substance, Marijuana offers many benefits to society. Currently, 11 states have legalized cannabis for recreational use, and 33 have legalized for medical use when prescribed by physicians. Marijuana arrests account for more than half of drug arrests within the US, costing taxpayers money to house these people who committed very low level offenses. Legalization would allow for police to focus on more dangerous issues/substances, allow for taxation, and create job growth in a rapidly expanding industry.

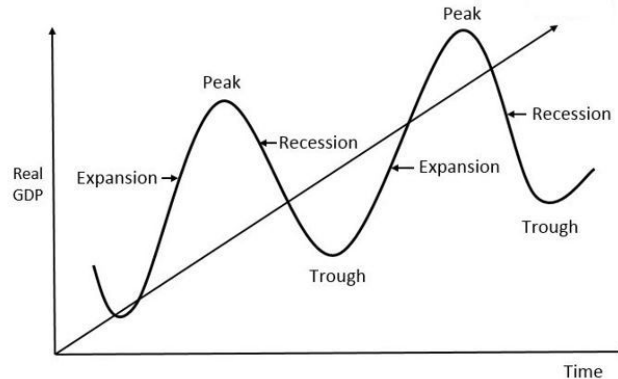
STATE CANNABIS LAWS
